Crossing roads Injury as result of pedestrian collision with vehicle	Students and Staff	4	2	Medium	 Roads will be crossed only at safe locations where visibility is clear and sufficient time is available to cross A member of staff will be designated and clearly responsible for overseeing the crossing of roads. All staff will be aware of a variety of different strategies for crossing roads e.g. in a long crocodile line, or small groups, one "wave" at a time Staff will choose the safest and most appropriate way for the group to cross road An experienced member of staff will remain in the road signalling traffic to stop whilst students are crossing if it is safe to do so Whatever happens, the safety of the group and staff is paramount and any choice must take this into account 	2	1	low

				of traffic.			
				Staff will ensure that group members walk in a single file			
				close to roadside			
				Staff will be positioned at the front and back of the group			
				and will wear bright/OXSS branded clothing			
				If the pavement is wide enough or the road very quiet,			
				some adults will walk alongside the group, usually on the			
				pavement on the side nearest to the road, but care will be			
				taken			
				Particular care will be taken around corners, when			
				oncoming traffic may not be visible			
				If visibility is poor, staff at the front and rear of the group will be positioned at an appropriate distance cheed and			
				will be positioned at an appropriate distance ahead and behind the group to give prior warning to oncoming
