PLANNING

Pre-event planning will include the following and will be confirmed in advance of an activity

- 1. Staff are familiar with the RAs the activity, location onsite and any risks inherent in the activity?
- 2. The Organiser has considered any RAs available from the location and passed on any relevant information to all relevant staff.
- 3. Students are advised on appropriate general behaviours: being respectful, behaving in a safe way, being considerate when taking photos etc, not eating or drinking.

Accidents					 This should be someone with specific experience of the activity planned overall staffing supervision ratios will be in accordance with the guidelines for on-site activities to ensure safe supervision of the activity Staff involved in the activity will remain accessible and available to assist with supervision throughout, including supervision of those not directly involved (e.g. reserves/spectators) Staff are aware of the basic rules of the game(s) Staff are made aware of their roles and responsibilities Staff are made aware of likely hazards and the agreed precautions and control measures there is an appropriately first aid trained member of staff available, and known to those supervising the activity that a first aid kit which has been checked and fully stocked is taken out to a central point on the activity site emergency procedures are discussed and contingencies established to deal with the treatment / transport to hospital of an injured group member

Exposure to weather: cold injury heat injury sunburn	Students and Staff	3	2	medium	 Ground conditions will be taken into consideration prior to the event, and alternative contingencies will be pre-planned for occasions when the conditions are deemed unsafe or unsuitable An up-to-date weather forecast will be obtained and plans will be adjusted accordingly. For example, if the weather forecast suggests excessive heat / sun might be a problem, staff will ensure that students have sun hats, sun cream, water / drinks and sufficient rest stops. Students will be instructed to wear/bring appropriate equipment, clothing and footwear for the prevailing weather/ground conditions Plans will be in place for students who arrive with unsuitable clothes or equipment (i.e. check this before playing).Remember students in this position must be supervised. 	2	1	low

Assault/Aggressive behaviour injury	Students and Staff	3	2	medium	 Staff will ensure, as far as possible, that: players are clearly briefed regarding expected behaviour and of the sanctions / response for unacceptable behaviour prompt action is taken by staff (e.g. substitute an offending player) if dangerous/aggressive behaviour is shown by players which puts themselves or others at risk of harm A qualified first aider is available on site at all times activities are taken place First aid kits are replenished if/when used 	2	1	low
